**Day 01/15MAY MANILA/CASABLANCA**

**Day 02/16MAY CASABLANCA, Morocco**  
Arrive in Casablanca, Morocco's economic capital. Casablanca is Morocco's modern seaport with a strong French accent, recalling scenes from the classic film of the same name, starring Humprey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman. Drive along the **United Nations Square**, the **Arab League Park**, Anfa's residential quarters and the Royal Palace. Visit the Old Medina. View the imposing **Hassan II Mosque**, built on a breathtaking setting on the shores of the Atlantic Ocean. Spend the night here. (D)

**Day 03/17MAY CASABLANCA / MARRAKECH**  
Drive to the red colored imperial city of Marrakech, situated in an oasis with more than a half million palm trees and surrounded by deep walls. On arrival, visit **Djemaa El-Fana**, the palpitating town center dominated by the 222-foot-high **Koutoubia Minaret**. Spend two nights here. (B,L,D)

**Day 04/18MAY MARRAKECH**  
Sightseeing includes views of the **Menara Park** with its manmade lake and quaint pavilion; **Bahia Palace**, with the elaborately decorated 16<sup>th</sup> century Saadian tombs. Catch up on your postcards or bargain hunts in the souk, the most picturesque open market in the world with its jugglers and snake charmers. Unforgettable! (B,L,D)

**Day 05/19MAY MARRAKECH / RABAT**  
Leave for Rabat, once a lair of the corsairs and now the country's cosmopolitan capital. View the massive medieval battlements, the **Royal Palace** and residence, **Mohammed V Mausoleum** and **Hassan Tower**. You will be reminded of the time when Morocco was the Roman province of Mauretania as you visit the fine Roman relics of **Chellah**. (B,L,D)

**Day 06/20MAY RABAT / FEZ**  
Drive along the highway to Fez, Morocco's cultural capital. Snap pictures of the magnificent entrance to the **Royal Palace**. Drive through the **Mellah**, the old Jewish Quarter. Travel on to the beautifully ornate Bab Bou Jeloud, the traditional entrance to old Fez. Visit the **labyrinthine Fes-El-Bali**, Morocco's largest medina; follow your local guide to exquisite Medersa Bou Inania; admire **Nejjarine Square** and its fountain, the Karaouiyme Mosque and University, Africa's oldest and the Mausoleum of Moulay Idriss. (B,L,D)

**Day 07/21MAY FEZ/TANGIER**  
Leave for Tangier, jumping off point for the Moorish conquest of Spain and the legendary medieval traveller, Ibn Batuta. Spend the night here. (B,L,D)

**Day 08/22MAY TANGIER/ALGECIRAS/COSTA DEL SOL, Spain**  
Depart for Algeciras and board a ferry for the trip across the Straits of Europe. Ready cameras as vistas of the Rock of Gibraltar are spectacular. Continue to your accommodation in Torremolinos along Costa del Sol, the Spanish Riviera. (B,L,D)

**Day 09/23MAY COSTA DEL SOL/MEJAS/GRANADA**  
Drive through the green hills above Costa del Sol to the White – washed village of Mejas. Stroll through the old streets and gardens and take in the views of the coast. Continue to Granada to visit the **Alhambra**, one of the most remarkable fortresses ever built. It's the gem of Moorish architecture! The mighty yet graceful citadel was planned by the 13<sup>th</sup> century Moorish ruler Al Ahmar. A fantasy of “lace in stone” surrounded by arabesque gardens and fountains, it affords superb views of the Old Quarter and Sacramonte, a mountain occupied by gypsy cave dwellers. Also see the magnificent water gardens of the **Generalife**, the royal summer residence. Indeed it's worth recognition as a World Heritage Site. (B,L,D)

**Day 10/24MAY GRANADA/CORDOBA/SEVILLE**  
Drive through the olive and orange groves of the rolling Andalusian hills as you travel from the foot of the Sierra Nevada to the fertile valley of the River Guadalquivir. A fascinating sightseeing of Cordoba, seat of three civilizations: Muslim, Christian and Jewish. See the **Alcazar**, the Roman bridge, and the medieval Old Jewish Quarter. Finally, tour the magnificent 8<sup>th</sup> century Mosque of the Caliphs (**Mesquita**), famous for its 850 pillars of porphyry, marble, and jasper. Continue to Seville, capital of Andalucia and most Spanish of the charming cities in Spain. (B,L,D)

**Day 11/25MAY SEVILLE**  
Sightseeing of this fourth biggest city of Spain. Visit the massive 15<sup>th</sup> century **Cathedral**, burial place of Christopher Columbus, which is enriched with the spoils of the New World. Nearby is the imposing **Giralda Tower**. See the **Alcazar**, a masterpiece of Moorish architecture and the **Sta. Cruz Quarter** of houses attractive with flower-decked balconies.

You may visit the gold gilded altars of the **Church of Our Lady of Macarena** made famous as it is there where bullfighters pray prior to a bullfight. . Another night here. (B,L,D)

**Day 12/26MAY SEVILLE/LISBON, Portugal**  
Drive through picturesque villages and olive orchards and arrive in Lisbon, declared “European Capital of Culture”. (B,L,D)

**Day 13/27MAY LISBON/SINTRA/FATIMA**  
Sightseeing will include a visit to the medieval quarter and Vasco da Gama's tomb inside the **Jeronimos** Monastery. View the **Belem Tower** with the splendid Monument to the Discoverers. Visit **St. Anthony Cathedral**. Remember St. Anthony, one of the few doctors of the church, was born here. Also visit Sintra Palace of the city declared European “Capital of Culture” and World Heritage Site. Its of 20<sup>th</sup> century Romantic architecture and landscape. Proceed to Fatima to attend the moving evening procession. (B,L,D)

**Day 14/28MAY FATIMA/SALAMANCA**  
Pray at the Fatima Shrine, at the Basilica with the tombs of the visionaries and at the Chapel of Apparition. Get water from the Miraculous Fountain. Visit the homes of the visionaries and realize their humble living then. Continue to the university city of Salamanca for sightseeing. Salamanca is famous for its golden stone buildings. See the handsome arcade of the Plaza Mayor and Puente Romano Bridge. Visit the La Casa de las Conchas (House of Shells) . Spend the night here (B,L,D)

**Day 15/29MAY SALAMANCA/AVILA/MADRID**  
Leave for Avila. Cross the rock strewn hills of La Morana to walk within the ancient walls of Avila. Its mysticism harks back to the days of Santa Teresa, a Doctor of the Church and of St. John of the Cross. Visit the convent and Santo Tomas Monastery. Continue to Madrid for the night. (B,L,D)

**Day 16/30MAY MADRID/TOLEDO/EL ESCORIAL/MADRID**  
Motor through arid landscapes of Don Quixote's La Mancha to **Toledo**- the whole city declared a World Heritage Site! Spectacularly situated on a hill surrounded by a loop of the Tagus River, the medieval Castillian capital attracts sightseers from all over the world. See the Moorish bridge, an early synagogue, the 13<sup>th</sup> century Gothic Cathedral and the Church of Santo Tome with one of El Greco's most famous paintings. Don't forget to visit one of the enticing Damascene art workshops. Visit the **Monastery of El Escorial**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It was the residence of the last years of Philip II's reign, after whom the Philippines was named. It's a monument to Spain's role as a center of the Christian world. It's a monastery, royal palace and museum. Back to Madrid for the night. (B,L,D)

**Day 17/31MAY MADRID/MANILA**

Morning sightseeing. Visit the Royal Palace, one of the three most impressive palaces in the world. Pass by Puerta del Sol, Plaza Espana with its monument to Cervantes, the Parliament, the stately Cibeles Fountain and imposing Alcala Avenue. Rest of the day is for shopping until transfer to the airport for your flight back home. (B,L)
