Day 01/Feb 11 MANILA/LOS ANGELES
Fly to Los Angeles. Check in to hotel for accommodation.

Day 02/Feb 12 LOS ANGELES/IGUAZZU FALLS
Transfer to the airport for your flight to Brazil via Lima.

Day 03/Feb 13 IGUAZZU FALLS, Brazil
Arrive in Iguassu Falls, Brazilian side. Check in to hotel for dinner and accommodation. (D)
Hotel: Recanto Cataratas Thermas Resort & Convention or similar

Day 04/Feb 14 IGUAZZU FALLS
Take pride in the world's biggest falls. Tour its Brazil side which offers a more panoramic view of Iguassu as you see its entire majestic grandeur. You will find rainbows crowning each waterfall which is truly lovely. Enjoy the macuco boat safari.

Day 05/Feb 15 IGUAZZU/RIO DE JANEIRO
After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight to Rio de Janeiro, known as "Cidade Maravillosa" or the Marvelous City. Check in hotel. Afternoon at leisure. Enjoy a churrascaria dinner. After dinner proceed to a local Samba Club to enjoy a lively Carnival -type Samba Show. (BD)

bustling part of Rio, famous for the colorful stairs called **Escadaria Selarón**. The neighborhood offers various unique and cultural activities in Rio and has a relaxing atmosphere which makes Santa Teresa a meeting point for artists writers, craftsmen and intellectuals. Lunch included.

Take the cable train to **Corcovado Mountain where Christ the Redeemer** as "New Seven Wonder of the World" stands. Unforgettable experience! It is perhaps Rio's most famous postcard picture.

TONIGHT, witness the splendid PARADE OF WINNERS of the Carnival at the SAMBADROME. It's a glorious experience of a lifetime! The event lasts until early morning the next day. Be ready to be back at hotel early morning the next day. (BLD)

Day 08/Feb 18 RIO DE JANEIRO/BUENOS AIRES, Argentina
Transfer to the airport for your flight to Argentina. Arrive in Buenos Aires, South America's most elegant city: cosmopolitan, modern, dynamic with its cafes and nostalgic tango bars. Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel for dinner and accommodation. (BD)

Day 09/Feb 19 BUENOS AIRES
Discover the life of gauchos. Learn the history and culture of the gauchos on a scenic journey into rural Argentina. The day unfolds with a series of activities, including horse-rides, a folklore show, and demonstrations of traditional gaucho skills, as well as a buffet of traditional cold cuts, cheeses, and beverages, and a typical country-style barbecue lunch, prepared using only the finest quality meats. Day 10/Feb 20 BUENOS AIRES/LIMA, Peru
Enjoy sightseeing of the "Paris in Latin America". Visit the main points of the city: Avenida 9 de Julio, Teatro de Colon, Plaza San Martin, the Plaza de Mayo, with its historical monuments, the northern Recoleta district, Palermo Park and the southern districts of San Telmo and colorful La Boca. Day 11/Feb 21 LIMA
Explore the rich and ancient past of Peru. See attractions of colonial and modern Lima, like the imposing churches and mansions such as Government Palace, Plaza Mayor, City Hall and Cathedral. Visit the Gold Museum, which houses one of Peru's largest private collections. It is located at the grounds of the family

residence of the Peruvian diplomat, Miguel Mujica Gallo, who spent a lifetime amassing this collection. It displays countless superb examples of pre-Hispanic gold, silver and copper articles. Visit the monastery and chapel of **St. Martin de Porres and St. Rose of Lima**. (BLD)

Day 12/Feb 22 LIMA/CUZCO/SACRED VALLEY
Transfer to the airport for your flight to Cuzco, ancient capital of the Inca Empire. Most picturesque! It is considered the archeological capital of the Americas. Tour the city visiting the Korincancha temple and the Cathedral. Continue to the surrounding ruins, the fortress of Sacsayhuaman overlooking the city, Kenko, Puca-Pucana and the Tambomachay ruins. The cathedral dominates the north-east side of the Plaza de Armas & sites squarely on the foundations of the Inca Viracocha's palace. In Sacsayhuaman, visitors are always impressed by the beauty and monumental scale of this important Inca construction. Drive to Sacred Valley for your accommodation. (BLD)
Hotel: Casa Andina Private Collection Valle Sagrado or similar

Day 13/Feb 23 MACHU PICCHU/SACRED VALLEY
Board the Hiram Bingham Luxury train for a full day tour of Machu Picchu, the "Lost City of the Incas", one of the most renowned examples of Inca architecture and a World Heritage Site. Surrounded by cloud forests, the citadel is perched on a mist-shrouded mountain top. Lunch in Machu Picchu. Dinner will be served on board the train. Head back to Sacred Valley for the night. (BLD)

Day 14/Feb 24 SACRED VALLEY/CUZCO
You will be driven through a scenic landscape to the Urubamba Valley, the "**Sacred Valley of the Incas**". In the route, stop at Awana Kancha and discover the beauty of South American camelids, guanacos, llamas, vicuña and alpacas, and an exhibition of traditional Andean textile art. Visit its significant Inca ruins dating from the end of the 15th Century, as well as the beautiful traditional church. Then arriving at the town of Pisac, you will visit the colorful **Pisac Market**, where the local indians meet to sell their merchandise as they have done it for centuries. There is also a handicraft market. The tour continues to the town of **Ollantaytambo** from where you will climb up to its imposing Inca fortress at the top of the mountain. (BLD)
Hotel: Ramada Hotel or similar

Day 15/Feb 25 CUZCO/LIMA/LOS ANGELES
Continue to the airport for your flight back to the U.S. via Lima. (BL)

Day 16/Feb 26 LOS ANGELES/MANILA
Arrive Los Angeles. Continue to your flight back home.

Day 15/Feb 25 CUZCO to SANTIAGO (via LIMA)

Arrive Santiago, meet your guide and transfer to your hotel.
 Hotel: NH Ciudad de Santiago or similar

Day 16/Feb 26 SANTIAGO

Full day tour to **Viña del Mar & Valparaíso**. Travel towards the Pacific Coast, through the valley of Casablanca, known for its vineyards, wine tasting at one of its vineyards. Visit the town of Viña del Mar with its pretty parks and floral ornaments. Continue to the picturesque port of Valparaíso, founded in the XVI century. The oldest part of town was recognized as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 2003. The town is built on many hills which are accessed by narrow streets, long stairways and a series of lifts which were built towards the end of the XIX Century. Back to Santiago for the night. (BL)

Day 17/Feb 27 SANTIAGO/PUNTA ARENAS

Tour through the main streets of the historic centre of Santiago, seeing on the way the Sta. Lucia hill, the Moneda Palace and the Plaza de Armas, where the Cathedral, National History Museum and the Central Post Office are located. Continue to Parque Forestal, the Fine Arts Museum and arrive at the bohemian area of Bellavista. It is considered the visit to San Cristobal Hill. Continue to the airport for your flight to Punta Arenas. (B)
 Hotel: Hotel Rey Don Felipe or similar

Day 18/Feb 28 PUNTA ARENAS
EXCURSIÓN DE MEDIO DÍA ISLA MAGDALENA

Isla Magdalena is a National Park located on the Straits of Magellan, north of Punta Arenas. In order to reach the island, one needs to sail for 2 ½ hours along a route that was also followed by other famous seafarers, such as Francis Drake, Pedro Sarmiento de Gamboa, Hernando de Magallanes and Charles Darwin himself. Once on the island, a hike leads to the large colonies of Chilean penguins, with an estimated population of 60,000 breeding pairs of Magellanic Penguins. It's also possible to reach the lighthouse, from where a lovely view of the island and surrounds can be admired. The visit to the island lasts for an hour or so. End of tour and return to the city of Punta Arenas. (B)

Day 19/Mar 01 PUNTA ARENAS /PUERTO NATALES

City tour of Punta Arenas with a visit to the Patagonia History Park. Tour starts out in Cerro de la Cruz (hill) to enjoy wonderful panoramic views of the city of Punta Arenas and its colorful roofs, the Strait of Magellan and Tierra del Fuego Island in the background. Next is a

visit of the main streets, monuments and buildings of the city, such as Museo Salesiano "Maggiorino Borgatello", Plaza de Armas square, traditional Cabo de Hornos hotel, the Cathedral, the Governor's Building and "Palacio Sara Braun" (the residence of one of the most influential families in the early days of the city). Head south to **Parque Historia Patagonia**, an area of forests that holds the key to the history of the Strait of Magellan. Here, the symbolic Bulnes Fort will be visited, with other nearby attractions such as Mirador Panoramico for photo sessions, walking along trails on the coast and forest, and enjoying a delicious cup of freshly-ground coffee at "Café Souvenirs", where souvenirs of the area can also be bought. Back to Puerta Natales for the night. Rest of the evening at leisure. (B)

Day 20/Mar 02 PUERTO NATALES

Full day Torres del Paine National Park, declared a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO in 1978. The impressive Andean Massif is surrounded by glaciers such as the Grey glacier, waterfalls, lakes and lagoons such as Pehoé, which together with a wide variety of flora and fauna make this one of the best known places in the world for its rich natural beauty. On the way back to Puerto Natales, visit the Milodón Cave where the remains of a prehistoric animal were found in the last century. (BL)

Day 21/Mar 03 PUERTO NATALES

Full day Navigation: Balmaceda & Serrano Glaciers. Sailing to the glaciers operates from October to March and is subject to weather conditions and orders of Marine Government of Puerto Natales.

The voyage starts at the EPA pier at Puerto Natales, within the province of Última Esperanza at 8:00 a.m. Once passengers are on board, enjoying a snack served by a crewmember, the vessel sails through Puerto Bories. The trip continues to Guanaco Island, where small and wonderful TONINA dolphins can be seen, as well as sea lions resting on the rocks. Then, through Estancia Margot, the trip continues to Pared de Cormoranes (Wall of Cormorants), where hundreds of cormorants can be seen spreading their wings at the wind. The trip continues to Balmaceda's Glacier. In Puerto Toro, passengers disembark to start a one-hour walk by the lake shore and through a native forest of coigües, towards Serrano Glacier, where they can enjoy the amazing vegetation with the contrast of clean sky and sea ice, all of this with the unique flavor of a whisky with millennial glacier ice and a second snack. Finally, the vessel departs from Puerto Toro, to Eberhard Fjord. Here, passengers enjoy a short walk through Puerto Consuelo ranch. Passengers enjoy a delicious barbecue on a big skewer/Magellan lamb barbecue at a quincho (special area where barbecues are prepared) at the Eberhard ranch. Then the vessel finally departs to Puerto Natales and passengers disembark at 05:00 p.m. (BL)

Day 22/Mar 04 PUERTO NATALES/PUNTA ARENAS

Drive to Punta Arenas and continue to the airport for your flight to Santiago and Los Angeles. (B)
