

This is for the inveterate traveler. This part of the world is unknown to most Filipinos but the marvels of architecture, history and legend, many seen in UNESCO Heritage Sites certainly deserves a second look. Here it is.

Day 01/Oct 09 MANILA/BUCHAREST

Day 02/Oct 10 BUCHAREST, Romania

Arrive in Bucharest, capital of Romania. Sightseeing around the city. Start from the Palace Square, a historic site surrounded by highly evocative edifices and monuments- visit of the iconic Athenaeum-the Revolution Square where the communist dictator Ceausesco held his last public speech (short account on the Romanian 1989 Revolution), university square. The beating heart of the present day Bucharest. Stroll around the Old Town along Elisabeta Boulevard, passing the City Hall and Cismigiu Garden. Continue to the Cotroceni district – Ceausescu’s House of the People, the communist era legacy currently housing the Romanian Parliament. Stop at the Patriarchy Hill, a sacred site with historical significance. (LD)

Day 03/Oct 11 BUCHAREST/SINAIA/PELES/BRASOV

Drive to **Sinaia**, known as the “Pearl of the Carpathians” due to its magnificent mountain scenery and Royal Castle. Visit the Sinaia Monastery, which was built between 1690 and 1695. Continue to **Peles Castle**, built in the late 19th century for Romania’s first monarch, King Carol I which took 39 years to complete. Built in German Renaissance style and completed in 1892. Spend the night in medieval Brasov. (BLD)

Day 04/Oct 12 BRASOV/BRAN CASTLE/BRASOV

Travel to Bran and visit “**Dracula’s Castle**”. The castle was created by the Saxons in the late 14th century to defend Brasov from invasion by the Turks. Back to Brasov for sightseeing. Walk around the old city walls. See the 15th century Town Hall with its quaint Trumpeter’s Tower on top, and the Lutheran Black Church. The Black Church is the largest gothic church in the country with its 7tone bell which is the largest in Romania. Continue to the Orthodox St Nicolas Cathedral and then t the First Romanian School (started in 1583) and see the statue of Coresi. (BLD)

Day 05/Oct 13 BRASOV/VELIKO TARNOVO, Bulgaria

Drive to the border and cross to Bulgaria. Arrive in Veliko Tarnovo, the old capital of Bulgaria. (BLD)

Day 06/Oct 14 VELIKO TARNOVO/SOFIA

Explore the capital of medieval Bulgaria, Veliko Tarnovo. Tour includes: Tsarevets architectural and museum reserve (medieval stronghold), Samovodskata charshin (lively craftsmen’s street), Assens’ monument and the museum village of Arbanassi – famous for its 17th and 18th architecture and the unique Church of the Nativity of

Christ, with well preserved murals depicting over 2,000 scenes. Continue to Sofia, capital of Bulgaria for the night. (BLD)

Day 07/Oct 15 RILA MONASTERY

Leave Sofia and travel through tranquil countryside to the heart of Rila Mountains – the highest mountain on the Balkan. Legends, history, beautiful nature and art are all abundant in and around Rila Monastery (UNESCO). Learn about the history of the biggest Bulgarian monastic complex with the lecture in the monastery museum. Inside the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Church, you will see the biggest gilded iconostasis on the Balkans, the grave of the last Bulgarian monarch (who played a significant part in saving the Bulgarian Jews during WWII). It is believed to have been founded by a hermit John of Rila in the 10th century during the reign of the Bulgarian Tzar Peter.

Sightseeing of Sofia: Palace of Justice, St. Nedelq Church, Statue of St. Sofia, Sofia Bath House, Largo Complex, National theatre Ivan Vazov, Russian Church, Hagia Sofia Church, the Cathedral St Alexander Nevski. Another night in Sofia. (BLD)

Day 08/Oct 16 SOFIA/SKOPJE, Macedonia

Drive to the border and cross to Macedonia. Arrive in Skopje, capital of Macedonia. Enjoy a walking tour around the city. Start at the plateau where the Museum of Contemporary Art is located, then to the Fortress Kare, Mustapha Pasha Mosque, the Church of the Holy Saviour (with the small museum of Gove Delchev). Continue through the Old Hammam, dating back to the 15th century. Visit the modern part of the city on the right bank of the River Vardar. Before we cross the Stone Bridge, the oldest landmarks of Skopje, see the Holocaust Memorial Center for the Jews of Macedonia and the Museum of the Macedonian Struggle for Independence, IMRO and the Victims of Communism. On the other bank is the main square with new statues and monuments. Visit the Memorial House of Mother Teresa. Spend a night here. (BLD)

Day 09/Oct 17 SKOPJE/OHRID

On to Lake Ohrid. Walk through the Lower Gate to the Archeological museum in the Robev family house with some ancient artifacts including a statue of the Goddess Isis. Continue to the 11th century cathedral church of St. Sofia, the Ancient Theater from the 2nd century BC and the beautiful icons at the Church of St. Mary Perivleptos. Get fantastic views of Ohrid Lake from the medieval walls of Samuil Fortress. Descend to Plaosnik at the crossroads of civilization on Ohrid Hill. Visit the burial place of St. Kliment, and the newly reconstructed church of St. Pantelejmon. Overnight here. (BLD)

Day 10/Oct 18 OHRID/TIRANA, Albainia

Cross into Albania and drive to Tirana, renowned for its unfailingly friendly locals. Meet your guide to a tour at the landmark Skanderbeg

Square for an insider’s look at the Albanian capital. Spend a night here. (BLD)

Day 11/Oct 19 TIRANA/KOTOR, Montenegro DUBROVNIK, Croatia

Drive through the spectacular scenery of Montenegro to the old town of Kotor, perched beside the only European fjord outside Norway. Next we visit the World Heritage Site of **Kotor** – a town which was inhabited from the times of the Illyrians and the Romans. Our walk through the city takes us back to medieval times, as most of the monuments we observe are from the 14th to 18th century. Visit the Cathedral of **St. Tryphon**, St. Luka Church, St. Mihail Church, amongst other sites. Enjoy a walking tour through the maze of the medieval quarter, its bustling market and beautiful Renaissance buildings. The well preserved fortified walls of Kotor protect it from the sea. Nearly three miles long it is considered one of the world’s historic values. Then continue to the Croatian border along the scenie, lovely coast up to Dubrovnik, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. (BLD)

Day 12/Oct 20 DUBROVNIK

If the Dalmatian Coast is the zenith of the Mediterranean, Dubrovnik is the jewel in the crown! Sightseeing in the Old Town ringed by a wall with its stone-paved streets inside the 16th century bastion. See Onofrio’s Fountain and the Rector’s Palace as well as the Franciscan and Dominican monasteries. A surprise awaits you. Another night here. (BLD)

Day 13/Oct 21 DUBROVNIK/MEDJUGORJE, Bosnia Herzegovina

Drive through the marvelous River Neretva to Mostar where you can walk across the famous **Stari Most** (Old Bridge), a World Heritage Site recently reconstructed. The cobbled old town stretches on both sides of the bridge and is filled with shops selling Turkish style souvenirs. Continue to Medjugorje for the night. Time for religious souvenirs, reconciliation and contemplation You may participate at the night services at St. James Church. (BLD)

Day 14/Oct 22 MEDJUGORJE/SARAJEVO

Climb the Apparition Hill. In this quaint village, Mary, the Queen of Peace has been appearing since June 24, 1981. The apparitions are continuing. Miracles are still happening. Rosary, prayer, praise singing. Drive to Sarajevo. Sightseeing will lead you through the labyrinth of streets that lie within the former palace of Emperor Diocletian. See St. Duje’s, the Temple of Jupiter (today a baptistery) and the Golden Gate. Overnight here. (BLD)

Day 15/Oct 23 SARAJEVO/BELGRADE, Serbia

Head down through the remote villages and spa resorts of the forested Bosnian mountains to Belgrade. Sightseeing will include a visit to St.

Sava Church, Terazije Street, the national museum and national theater in Republic Square. End sightseeing at the Kalemegdan Fortress, situated at the confluence of the Sava and Danube Rivers. (BLD)

Day 16/Oct 24 BELGRADE/MANILA
The day is at leisure until transfer to the airport for your flight back home. (B)

Day 17/Oct 25 ARRIVE IN MANILA
